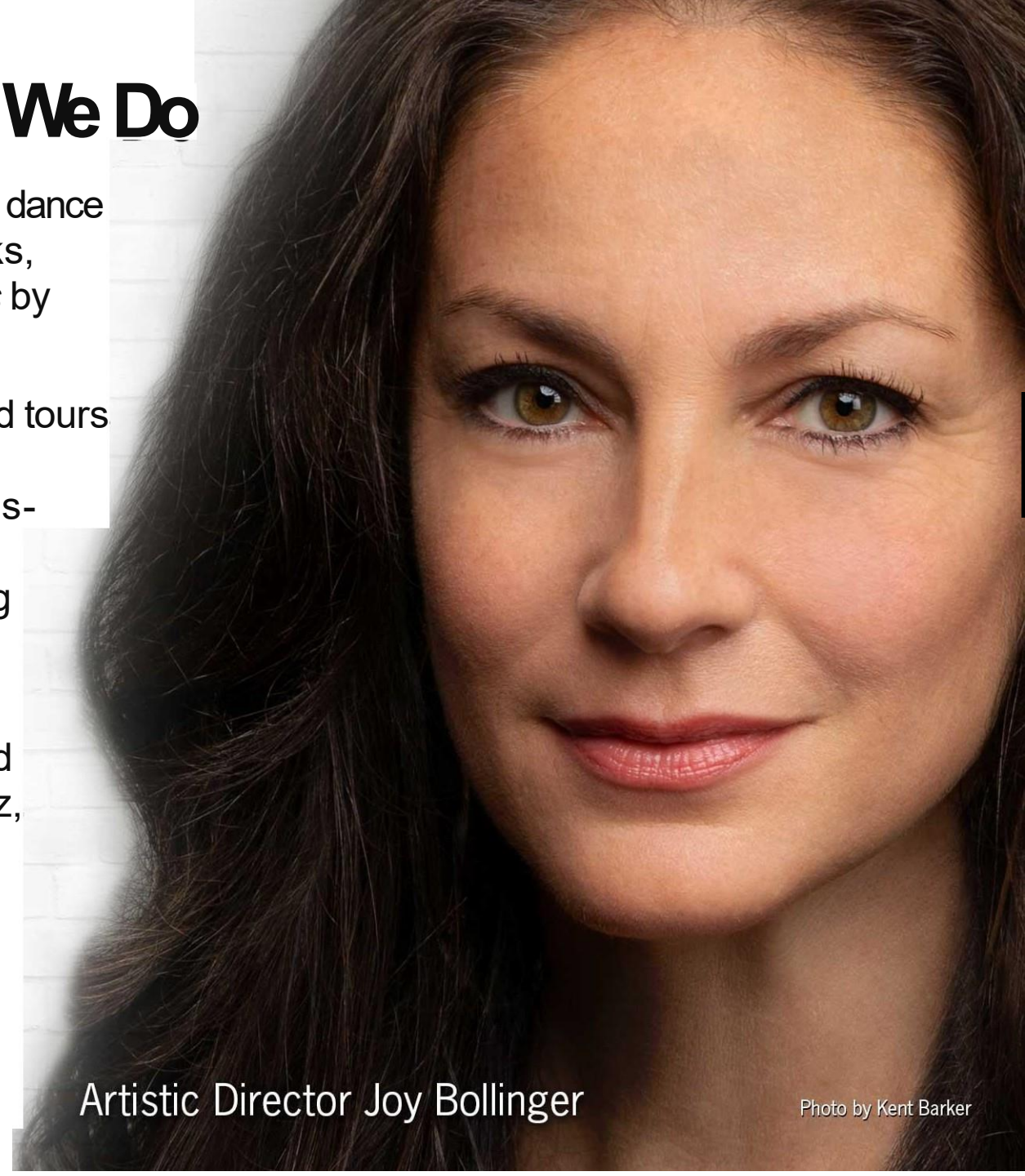


Bruce Wood Dance Dallas-What We Do

- Produce Bruce Wood's repertoire; commission new works for dance and film by world-class choreographers; license masterworks, including five works by Lar Lubovitch; and *Nine Sinatra Songs* by Twyla Tharp; and provide community engagement programs.
- Perform regionally and nationally: 2023-24 highlights included tours to *Battery Dance Festival* (NYC); *Palm Desert Choreography Festival* (CA); Guggenheim Museum's Works & Process Series- *Lar Lubovitch at 80: Art of the Duet* (NYC); *Spring to Dance Festival* (MO), and *Red Rock Dance Festival* (UT). TCA Touring Roster since 2016.
- Cultivate equity and inclusion through collaborations, hiring, board leadership, and commissioning new work by BIPOC and ALAANA choreographers, such as Yin Yue, Stephanie Martinez, Norbert De La Cruz III, Omar Roman De Jesus, and more.

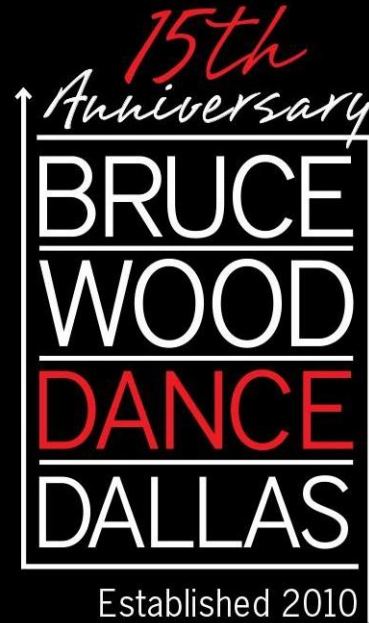

Bath House Cultural Center (D9):



Hosted the 1st Annual AAPI Heritage and Dragon Boat Festival on May 19, 2024. The festival was produced in partnership with the Community Arts division, Parks and Recreation Department and generated attendance of approximately 7,000 people. **(REP Ei #37; DCP Strategies #1, #3, #8, #29)**

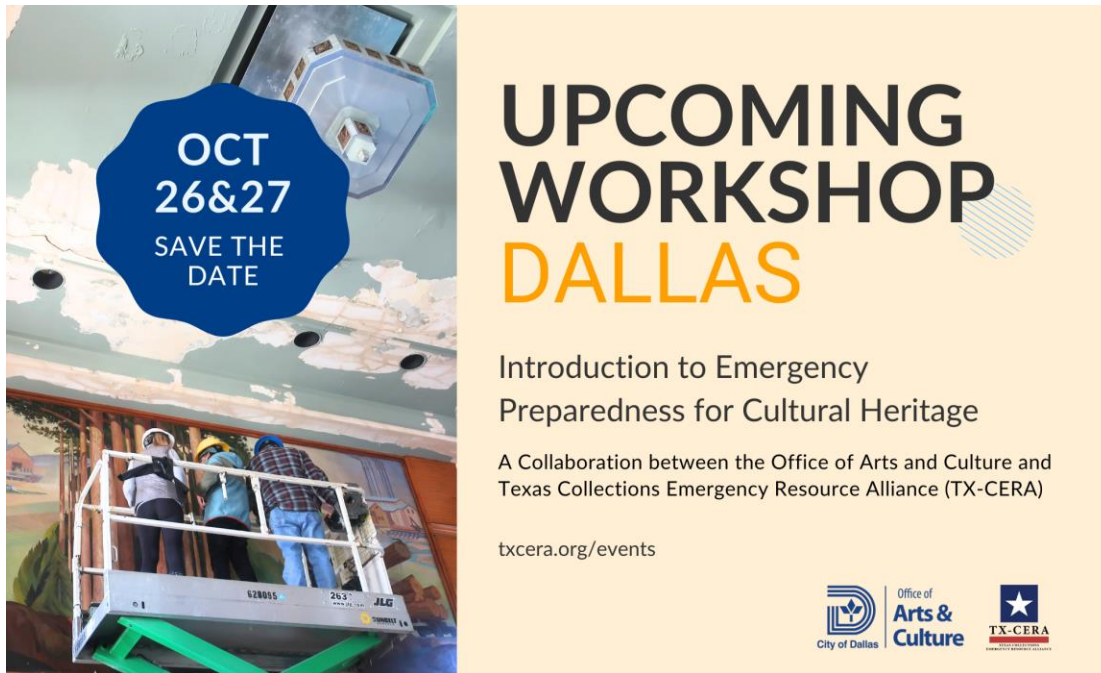

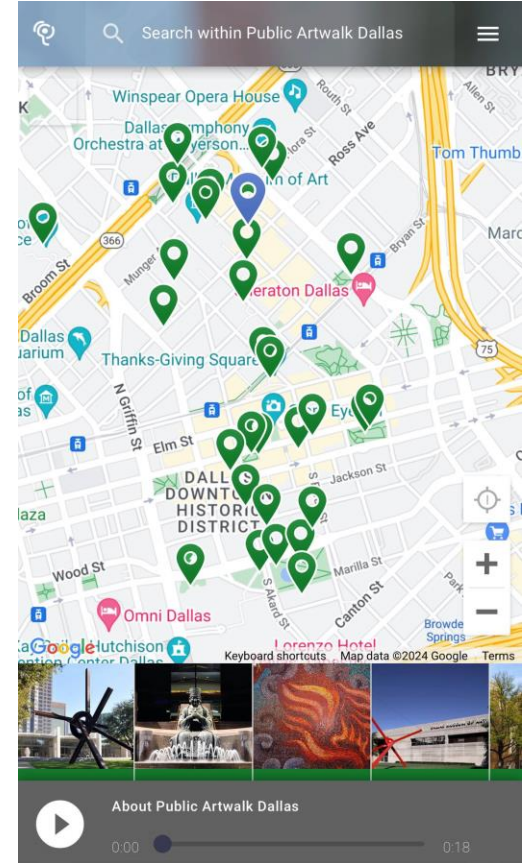

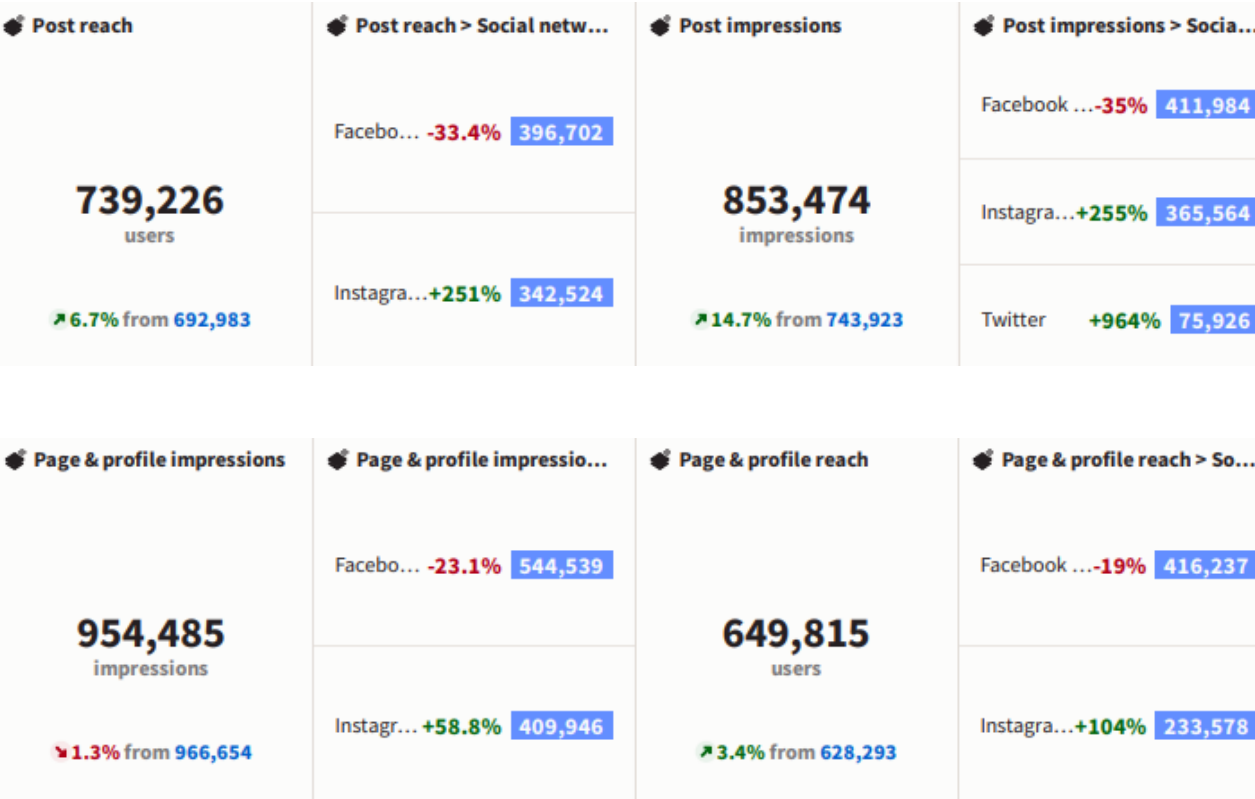
